The Reel of the 51st Division

Bars	(32 Bar Reel)
1 - 8	$1^{\rm st}$ couple set to each other and cast off two place on own side. They meet below the $3^{\rm rd}$ couple and lead up the middle to face their first corners. $2^{\rm nd}$ couple step up on bars $3-4$.
9 - 12	$1^{\rm st}$ couple set to and turn first corner with the right hand finishing in diagonal line by joining left hands with partner.
13 - 14	1 st couple and 1 st corners balance in line.
15 - 16	$1^{\rm st}$ couple - leaving first corners in place - turn each other one and a quarter times to face second corners.
17 - 20	$1^{\rm st}$ couple set to and turn second corner with the right hand finishing in diagonal line by joining left hands with partner.
21 - 22	1 st couple and 2 nd corners balance in line.
23 - 24	1 st couple cross to own side in second place.
25 - 32	2^{nd} , 1^{st} and 3^{rd} couples dance six hands round and back.
	Repeat having passed a couple.
